

The State of Alabama, This indenture made this
 thirty, to-wit 30th day of April Eighteen
 hundred fifty two between Robert F. Armstrong
 of the first part, Charles S. Rawley of the second part
 and Mc Butler of the third part all of the state and county
 above named. Witnesseth that whereas the said Robert
 F. Armstrong is indebted to the said Mc Butler the sum
 of one hundred sixteen or 1600 Dollars the same being four
 promissory notes three of which notes are dated April 17

17 1851 due one day after date with interest from 1st Jan
1851 two of these three notes being for thirty dollars each
the other for thirty seven 19/100 dollars these three notes
last named being signed by E. Armstrong as security
the other note being for Nine 9/100 dollars dated 8th April
1852 due one day after date with interest from 1st
January 1852 all of which notes at the date of this
instrument (about) amount to the above named
sum of One Hundred Sixteen 87/100 Dollars. —
I Robert J. Armstrong have bargained sold aliened and
conveyed & by these presents doth bargain sell alien and
convey unto the said Charles D. Rawley for and in
consideration of the sum Two Dollars of lawful
money by the said Charles D. Rawley to the said Ro-
bert J. Armstrong in hand paid at and before
the signing and delivering of these presents the
receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the following de-
scribed crops now planted and growing to wit —
so much of my crop of cotton now planted and
growing as will make Ten bales and parcels in
the said also much of my crop of corn as will
make in good and lawful measure one Hundred
and fifty Bushel both of which crops are to be gathered
and picked by the said Robert J. Armstrong
I the said Robert J. Armstrong do for myself
my heirs and assigns warrant and will con-
firm unto the said Charles D. Rawley a good
and lawful right to the crops herein described
against all and every person whatsoever in trust
nevertheless should the said Robert J. Armstrong
payer cannot to be paid to the said Robert J.
the notes herein described at the time when
the said Robert J. Armstrong fail to pay
the same or prior before the first day of November
next in that case the said Charles D. Rawley
may proceed to sell the crops herein described
at the house where the said Robert J. Armstrong
now lives first giving fifteen days notice &
then the said Charles D. Rawley shall apply the proceeds
to the payment of the notes herein described and if
there should remain a balance in the hands of the
said Charles D. Rawley arising from the sale of the
within described crops after paying the notes.
