

The State of Alabama, Know all men by these presents,  
Shelby County } that I Benjamin H Randall  
are held and firmly bound to John C. Sneed James C.  
O'Hara and William J O'Hara the Trustees appointed  
and acting as such for Mrs. Fanny Cobb under and by  
her Deed made and Executed the Twenty ninth Sept 1843  
now of Record in Shelby County Court in the presence  
Two thousand dollars to the payment of which moneys  
Truly to be made I bind myself my heirs Executors  
and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these  
presents sealed with my seal and dated this 28 day  
of December 1843. the condition of this obligation  
is such that whereas the above B H Randall has  
this day sold to the above named Sneed O'Hara & O'Hara  
as trustees for Mrs Fanny Cobb the following described  
land lying and being in said County known as  
falling to wit the West half of the north West quarter  
the north East fourth of the north West fourth of the  
north West fourth of the south West fourth of section  
no Eighteen Township Twenty one Range one East  
for the sum of nine hundred dollars to be due  
as follows to wit three hundred dollars with  
interest from date to fall due first day of January  
1845 Three hundred dollars with interest from  
date to fall due the first of January 1846 and the  
summing three hundred dollars with interest  
from date to fall due the first January 1847 now  
if said Randall shall well and truly make  
and deliver to said Trustees as such <sup>trusty</sup> persons  
for said land with relinquishment of Dower as  
on the full payment of said consideration money  
then this obligation to be void Else to remain  
in full force and effect my hand and seal as  
pursaid
