Whereof I do hereby acknowledge have and do by this pres-
 ently grant bargain and sell unto the said C. Cum-
 -mington, &c. - their Executors administrators and assigns
 a certain six horse Wagon to have and to hold the said
 Wagon to the said C. Cummington &c. their Executors
 administrators & assigns forever - Provided always and
 it is hereby agreed by the parties to these presents that if
 the said O. H. Castle may execute &c. do and shall will
 and truly pay or cause to be paid to the said Cum-
 -mington &c. or their Executors & the sum of Eighty three 96/10
 dollars by the first day of January next according to the
 condition of a certain note bearing date hereunto
 given by me the said O. H. Castle to the said Cum-
 -mington &c. then these presents to be void And I the said
 O. H. Castle for myself my Executors &c. do give unto the
 said C. Cummington &c. their Executors & that in
 case default be made in the payment of the said sum
 of Eighty three 96/100 dollars. At the time limited for
 the payment thereof it shall & may be lawful for the
 said C. Cummington &c. their Executors &c. to take
 possession of said six horse wagon and all the same
 to the highest bidder for cash at Marketable and out
 of the proceeds pay said note & all expenses attending
 the same & the surplus if any to be paid to me
 - and until default is made in the payment of
 said note I the said Castle am to remain in quiet
 possession aforesaid Wagon in witness whereof I have
 here to set my hand & seal this the first day of September
