A. Brasher the receipt of which I have acknowledged. Healey have bargained & sold and do by these presents bargain & sell unto the said J. A. Brasher a negro girl named Caroline about four years old yellow complexion to have and to hold said negro girl to them heirs their heirs & assigns administrators or assigns forever and I said Healey by these presents warrant & will ever defend the right & title to said negro girl unto said Brasher & co

I do trust however and this conveyance is on this condition that if said note is paid on or before the day of its maturity then this conveyance to be void but if not fully paid said Brasher or either of them so soon may then after as they or either of them may think proper seize and sell said negro girl after ten days notice at the court house door of said County for cash and out of the proceeds shall pay and satisfy

1.19. to balance sum may be due on said note then
except if any pay amt. to me or anyone. Witness
