

The State of Alabama This Deed of Trust made
 Shelby county 3 and Entered into the
 28. day of September 1852 between Joshua Seal
 the debtor of the 1. part, and Blanton Moore
 of the 2. part Witnesseth that the said Moore
 heretofore became the security of said Seal
 to James C. Heard on three promissory
 notes for one hundred dollars each due and
 follows. to wit 1st, due 25 December 1852. 2d
 25 December 1853. & 3d due 25 Decr. 1854. Which said
 notes was given for the land hereafter named
 against the payment of which said notes
 the said Seal is anxious and desirous to
 secure protect and hold harmless said Moore
 therefore and in consideration of

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the premises as well the sum of one dollar
to him on hand paid said sale has since
granted bargain and sold and by these
premises; does give grant bargain and sell
to said Moore the full living land viz
the NW 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Section 11. & the SE 1/4
of NE 1/4 of Section 10 Township 22 Range
1 West. to have and hold the same in Trust
for him until default, he made in the payment
of the notes aforesaid or either of them then said
Moore his heirs assigns or Representatives may
seize and sell said land to the highest bidder
for cash first giving twenty days notice of
the time and place of said sale in at
least three public places in the vicinity
of said lands and out of the proceeds of
said sale pay and satisfy said several
debts; the costs hereof and the balance
if any pay over to said sale but should
said notes be fully paid by said sale
then this deed is null and void of
full force. Witness our hands and seals
this day and year aforesaid
Jashad Seal not
work.
