

I Robert B Wilson of the county of Sumner and State of Virginia do make and constitute this my last will and testament in manner and form following,

1st I wish all my just debts paid & I leave to my beloved wife the Sarah Wilson during her life the tract of land on which I now reside in the county of Sumnerburg also the following slaves together with their further increase (namely) Moares Simon, Patrick, Willis, Lucy, Charlotte & her two youngest children, Leith & Andrew, their child Sally & Molly also all my household & kitchen furniture a sufficiency of plantation tools for the hands owned by my Wagon and Buggy, three head of horses, 1 yoke of Oxen and cart three barbed calves twelve head of sheep ten head of hogs all the crop made on the plantation on which I live the year that I die & the property given and delivered to my sons William & Wilson, Ephraim & Wilson James & my daughter Rocy and Miriah I do hereby confirm to them and their heirs forever - 4th I give unto my daughter Hannah R. three Nigras viz Manford, Charity & Dela. together with their further increase the sum of five hundred dollars one bed & furniture one bureau, saddle & bridle to her and her heirs forever - 5th I give to my son Robert B two Nigras to wit Lay, Henry & Clara and together with their further increase one bed and furniture and at the death of his mother the tract of land owned by her to him and his heirs forever. 6 I give to my daughter Hannah, the tract of land lying in the County of Marklandburg known by the name of Buck Horn, one negro girl Diana with her further increase one bed and furniture one Bureau one saddle and bridle to her and her heirs forever 7 I give to my Granddaughter the daughter of my son James and the sum of five hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever 8 I place in the hands of my friend William A Stone in special trust and confidence for the support

+ maintenance of my daughter Sally Ann Brown
 + her children. and for the education of her children
 the full unvying property to wit the tract of land lying
 in the county of Rockingham estimated at Six hundred
 acres adjoining the land of William C. Wilson & others
 also the full unvying slaves (to wit) Martha & child Sindy
 & two children Sus. Fanny and Fred together with their
 future Increase to be used at the discretion of the said trustee
 for the purposes aforesaid and should it be necessary in order
 to educate the children the trustee is hereby authorized
 to sell a part of the slave for that purpose and at the death
 of said daughter I wish the property aforesaid equally
 divided among her children and if she die leaving no
 child I wish John Brown her husband to enjoy the use
 of the profits of said Estate during his life & at his death
 to return to my estate be subject to the same division
 as my other property not specially disposed of & I place
 in the hands of the said William C. Wilson in like
 manner for the support of my daughter Martha E. Farns.
 and her children and for the education of them the
 following property to wit a tract of land in the county
 of Rockingham near Bogatto containing an hundred
 and thirty five acres on which Henry Farns now
 resides and three slaves Melinda Archer & William to-
 gether with their future Increase and bed and furniture
 and one cow Brown to be used at the discretion
 of said trustee for the purposes aforesaid and should
 it be necessary in order to educate the children of the
 said Martha the trustee is hereby authorized to sell
 a portion of the slaves for that purpose at the death
 of my daughter Martha I wish the afore mentioned
 property to be equally divided between the children
 of my said ^{daughter} Martha but should she die and leave
 no child living I wish Henry Farns her husband
 to enjoy use of the profits of said estate during his life
 and at his death to return to my Estate and be subject
 to the same division of my property not specially
 disposed of and should the trustee that I have appointed
 refuse to act I wish the court to appoint one
 so the residence of my estate not disposed of I wish
 sold and the proceeds thereof divided into seven equal
 parts one to my son William C. Wilson and
 Ephraim C. one to my daughter Roxana for ever and
 to Meriah one to Hezekiah P. D. and one to Hannah S.

11. The property to my wife except the land at her death I wish sold and the proceeds thereof divided into Eight equal parts one to William E. Wilson one to Ephraim S. and one to Robert one to Hearen R. and one to Hearen R. and one to Hearen R. and one to Hearen R. and one part to be equally divided between my grand children (the children of Sally Brainerd & the other E. James to them & to their heirs forever. 1. 2. 11. Should my wife and a majority of my legates consider it to be to the interest of her she is hereby authorized a portion or all and put the money part at interest and my wife - using the interest only should any difficulty among my legates in relation to my will it is my will to present Law Suits among them and I desire that three or four of my neighbors be selected to settle such difficulty and their decision shall be final, and should either of my legates refuse to abide by such decision my will is that they have no more of my Estate than that they have already rec'd. Lastly I constitute and appoint my Wife Hannah Wilson and William E. Wilson Executors to this my last Will & Testament Signed and sealed 22 July 1847. Robert B. Wilson Seal
