to sell or dispose or remove from beyond the reach of said
J. L. Wilson of the second part the above described property
Without the consent of the said Wilson and the Corbuckle
of the first part hereby acknowledges the right of the said
Wilson to sell the above described property to the highest
bidder after giving ten days notice after the first of
January Eighty and fifty three now if the said
Luke Corbuckle of the first part in this indenture pays to
the said Wilson the foresaid amount in cash or in any
way arrange it to the satisfaction of the said J. L. Wilson
by the first day of January Eighty hundred and
fifty three then this obligation or indenture to be
null and void Else to remain in full force and
