 hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-
 ledged have this day bargained and sold Enfranch-
 ised and Confirmed and by these Presents do barg-
 ain and sell Enfranchise and Confirm to the party
 of the second part all that lot or parcel of land
 lying and being in the County of Shelby Kentucky
 described as follows to wit all that fraction or
 part of the East half of the N E quarter of Sec
 19 T 22 & Range then West which lies south of
 the Creek Commonly Called Johnsons Creek and
 which was formerly known as a part of the
 Anna Fisher tract containing more or less 58 1/2 acres
 To have and to hold the afore
 granted premises to the said Geo D Shortridge
 and his heirs forever and we do Covenant with
 the said Shortridge that we are lawfully seized
