

The State of Massachusetts This Indenture made and entered
 Hallowe'en county 3 into this 29th day of November
 A.D. 1852 between Washington H. Adams of the first part
 & Hudson W. Nelson of the second part Witnesseth
 that Whereas the said party of the first part is greatly indebted
 to the said party of the second part in the sum
 of sixty dollars evidenced by promissory notes of even
 date with this instrument due in twelve months
 from date the payment of which said note
 the said party of the first part is anxious to secure
 to the party of the second part now in consideration
 of the premises & the sum of one dollar in hand paid
 to the said party of the first part by said party of the
 second part the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
 the said party of the first part has this day bargained
 sold & conveyed & by these presents does bargain sell
 & convey to the said party of the second part certain
 bright Bay horse with a small store in his forehead
 about five years old known as the Henderson horse
 to have & to hold unto the said party of the second
 part to his use & behoof forever subject however to the
 following stipulations and conditions that is to say
 the said party of the first part is to have the peaceable
 possession & use of said horse until default be made in
 the payment of the aforesaid sum of money of any
 part thereof that in the event of such default the said

party of the second part is hereby authorized & empowered to seize & take into his possession said horse and after giving twenty days notice of time & place of said sale at the public place in said county sell said horse at Heepersville in said county to the highest bidder for cash and out of the proceeds of said sale pay said note or so much thereof as may be remaining then unpaid together with the reasonable expenses of this venture and the balance of the proceeds of said sale if any pay over to the said party of the first part and should said promissory note & the expenses of this instrument be fully paid without default on the part of the said party of the first part then this conveyance to be wholly void otherwise to be in full force - Witness the hands & seals of the said parties the date first above written
