

This Indenture made and entered into this twenty
 Eighth day of June A D 1850 between Horace Butler
 & John M. Butler of the one part and Blessingham
 Nabors and John Sumner of the other part Witnesseth
 that whereas under a purchase by the said Horace
 Butler of three fourths only of lot No 14 in the Town
 of Newcastle the said Horace Butler obtained
 a deed conveying to him the title to the whole
 of said lot and whereas also the Equable title
 to the one fourth of said lot as herein after descri-
 bed is in the said Blessingham Nabors and
 John Sumner now therefore in consideration
 of the premises the said Horace Butler & family
 Butler husband and wife hereby convey transfer and
 forever quit claims to the said Blessingham
 Nabors and John Sumner the said one fourth
 of said lot to wit one fourth of lot No 14 in
 the East corner of said lot the said lot compris-
 ing at right angles with main street in the
 Town of Newcastle and an said street which
 runs forty five (45) degrees west of both said fourth
 of said lot includes a house known at George's
 grocery house and contains thirty seven feet front
 an said main street and receding back from
 said street about one hundred and forty eight
 feet supposed to contain about an eighth of an
 acre to have and to hold to the said Blessingham
