 the payment of said debt therefore
 in consideration of the said ind-
 -obtained and the further consid-
 eration of one dollar to the said
 party of the second part in hand
 paid by the said party of the first
 part the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged the said party of
 the ~~first part~~ second part - Sheth
 this day sold and hereby sells
 & conveys to the said party of the
 first part the crop to be raised

upon the farm now occupied by the said party of
of the second part to wit land acres to be
planted in cotton and thirty acres to be planted
in corn and the said party of the second part
hereby bind him self to cultivate the said crop
to getting the same and it is further hereby agreed
that if the said party of the second part shall fully
pay the said debt on or before the first day of June
next then this indenture to be void & null other-
wise it is hereby agreed and the said party of the
first part is hereby authorized an default being
made in said payment to take possession of said
crop of corn and cotton and sell the same
to the highest bidder for cash after giving
notice by advertisement posted up at three
public places and out of the proceeds of said
sale to retain the said debt together
with such interest as may be due thereon
together with the cost thereof and the
balance if any pay over to said
party of the second part given
