

The State of Alabama This Indenture made this the
 thirty county 30th day of April A.D. 1853
 between C. Wood of the first part William L. Prater
 of the second part and Francis Nobbs of the
 third part Witnesseth that whereas the said
 William L. Prater is security for the said C.
 Wood on a promissory note for the sum of \$20.60.
 payable to said Francis adm^r of Joseph Wood
 and on the 15th of December 1853 the said C. Wood
 is desirous to secure the said William L. Prater
 from all damage and the said C. Wood has
 have sold and conveyed & by these presents
 do sell and convey unto the said Francis
 Nobbs for and in consideration of the sum
 of five Dollars to the said Francis Nobbs
 the said C. Wood paid the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged the following described
 property to wit a Negro girl named Spetsy
 aged thirteen years & a negro boy named William
 aged 7 years and the said C. Wood for my
 self my heirs &c. warrant & defend unto the said
 Francis Nobbs a good and lawful title to the
 above conveyed property in trust unto the
 use thereof the said C. Wood pay or cause
 to be paid the above described note by
 the first of Dec 1853 or in any manner release
 the said William L. Prater from his liability
 as security of aforesaid then this obligation
 to be void but should the said C. Wood
 fail to pay the said note and before the
 15th day of December A.D. 1853 or to release the
 said William L. Prater from his liability
 as security of aforesaid in that case the said
 Francis Nobbs may proceed to sell the property
 herein described in all articles first giving
 fifteen days notice & then the said Francis
 Nobbs shall apply the proceeds to payment of

of the note above described and if there should remain a balance in the hands of the said Thrush Hobbs arising from the sale of the above described property then the said Thrush Hobbs shall pay the same to the said C Wood after paying the expenses of carrying this trust into effect.
