 the second part. Both of the County and State
 of said Waterpelt that whereas the said
 party of the first part is greatly indebted
 to the said party of the second part in
 the sum of One hundred and ten Dollars
 and the 25 of Dec. next now the said party
 of the first part has this day bargained &
 sold unto the said party of the second
 part all of his winter crop of corn oats
 cotton and what the said party of the
 first part is to getting said crop and how
 the wheat crop thrashed and getting the corn
 and peck out the cotton and deliver the

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cotton at New Orleans in good order and the
said party of the second part is to take
charge of said crop and dispose of it in
the best manner he may think and should
there remain in the hands of the said
party of the second part and above I
sufferfully to pay the above named sum one
hundred & ten Dollars and expense of this and
of trust he then shall pay it over to the said
party of the first part The said party of the
second part hath paid unto the unto the
said party of the first part one Dollar in hand
before the sealing and delivering the same.
