 use and behoof forever. And we do covenant with the said
 Wm. Butler his heirs Executors administrators and assigns
 that we are seized lawfully seized in fee of the afore-granted
 premises that they are free of all incumbrances. that we have
 a good right to sell and convey the same to the said
 Wm. Butler his heirs Executors administrators and
 assigns and that we will warrant and defend the said
 premises to the said Wm. Butler his heirs Executors ad-
 ministrators and assigns forever against the lawful
 claims and demands of all persons. In testimony
