The State of Alabama This Indenture made and entered
 Shubby county 3 into this the Twenty third day
 of June an thousand Eight hundred and fifty three
 Between A. J. Nelson of the first part & A Sec of the
 second part both of the County of Shubby & State of
 Alabama Witnesseth that Whereas the said A
 J Nelson is indebted to the said A Sec in the
 sum of forty seven 53 1/4 Dollars and that the said
 A. J. Nelson is desirous and willing to secure the
 said A Sec in the above sum \$ 47. 53 1/4 by the
 said A. J. Nelson both this day bargained and
 sold and do by these presents Bargain and sell
 all of his interest crop of Corn & Cotton and a
 certain bay horse now in the possession of the said
 Nelson, both paid unto the said Nelson one
 Dollars in hand. The Receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged and the said Nelson is to get the
 the said crop in good time and deliver the cotton
 crop at the said Nelson's house and he the
 said Sec is to take charge of said crop and dispose
 of it in the best way he may think and apply
 to said debt and if there should remain in the
 hands of the said Sec any and above what will
 pay the debt he should pay it over to the said Nelson
 and should the crops fail to pay to said debt and
 expenses of this trust the said Sec may dispose
 of said horse after giving public notice ten days
 before sell his testimony whereof I have here to
 set my name and affixed my seal day & year
 just above written A. J. Nelson
