grant bargain sell enfeoff & confirm unto the said William F. McKee his heirs & assigns the following parcel of land to wit all of the North East fourth of the North East fourth of section five in Township twenty four of range thirteen east that lies south of the present Road running from Montevallo to the Shelby Springs reservoir of the horse lot containing ten acres more or less the said land lying and being in Shelby County Alabama subject to entry at Tuscaloosa Alabama to have & to hold the aforegranted premises to the said William F. McKee his heirs & assigns to him use & behoof forever we do Covenant unto the said William F. McKee his heirs & assigns that we are lawfully seized in fee of the aforegranted premises that they are free from all encumbrances that we have a good right to sell & convey the same to the said William F. McKee his heirs & assigns forever against the lawful claims & demands of all persons in trespass whereof we the said Julius & Martha Alphin have hitherto set our hands & affixed our seals this 2nd day of September 1853.
