To all whom these presents shall come greeting
Whereas in pursuance of the act of Congress
approved September 28th 1850 entitled
"An act granting Bounty land to certain
Officers and soldiers who have been engaged
in the Military service of the United States"
Warrant No. 10,882 for 80 acres issued in
favor of Isaac Johnson private in Captain
Keen's Company Alabama Volunteers
War of 1812 has been returned to the
General Land office with evidence

that the same has been duly located upon the West. half. of the South East. quarter of section four-
teen in Township thirteen of Range two West in the
District of land subject to sale at Tuscaloosa
Alabama containing twenty nine acres and sixty
four hundredths of an acre according to the official
Plat of the survey of the said land returned
to the general land office by the surveyor
general. Now know ye, that there is therefore
granted by the United States unto the said
Isaac Johnson the tract of land above descri-
bed to him and to hold the said tract of
land with the appurtenances thereof unto
the said Isaac Johnson and his heirs and
assigns forever. In testimony whereof
Mellord Fillmore President of the United
States of America have caused these letters
to be made patent and the seal of the
general land office to be hereunto affixed
Given under my hand at the City of Washing-
ton the tenth day of December in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and fifty and one and of the Independence of the
United States the twenty sixth
