Note dated 22^d day of Feb 1834 and due as
 above stated which debt the said debt
 the said James O'Hara and Cynthia
 O'Hara are willing and anxious to pay
 Secured have this Indenture Witnesseth that
 for and in consideration of the premises
 and also for the further Consideration of
 one Dollar to us in hand paid by the said
 Daniel E. Watrous at and before the sealing
 and delivering of these presents the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged by the
 said James O'Hara & Cynthia O'Hara
 have given granted bargained sold relea-
 sed & confirmed by these presents do give
 grant bargain sell release & confirm un-
 to the said Daniel E. Watrous his heirs &
 assigns forever the following Slaves (viz)
 Maria a negro Woman Slave aged forty two
 years Charles a boy Slave aged about Twenty
 One years Emily a negro girl aged sixteen
 years Clara a girl Slave aged fourteen years
 Rasetta a girl aged thirteen years Josephus
 a boy aged Eleven years Tom a boy aged Eight
 years Louisa a girl aged six years Louisa
 a girl aged three years Jerry a Woman
 aged fortyfour years Jasper a boy aged
 seven years. To have & to hold the said Slaves
 and the future increase of the families
 thereof unto the said Daniel E. Watrous
 his Executors administrators his & assigns for-
 ever and the said James O'Hara and
 Cynthia O'Hara do hereby Covenant prom-
 -ise and agree with the said Daniel E. Watrous
 his heirs Executors and administrators that af-
 -ter said Slave with the Increase of their
 families thereof unto the said Daniel E.
 Watrous against all persons shall and
 law warrant and forever defend by these
 presents before trust notwithstanding that the
 said Daniel E. Watrous shall permit the
 said James O'Hara to remain in quiet
 & peaceable possession of said Slaves un-
 -less default be made in the payment of
 said debt of sixteen hundred and

Eighteen dollars Either in whole or in part
and upon this further trust that both said
Daniel & Matrons shall and will so soon
after the happening of such default as
the said John Gillispie shall request or
he shall think best sell said Slaves with
their increase at public auction for ready
money to the highest bidder at Montevallo
having given thirty days Notice of the time
& place of said Sale by written advertise-
ments posted up in Montevallo and out
of the proceeds pay the Costs of this deed &
then pay said debt to said John Gillispie
But if no default be made in the payment
of said debt when the same becomes due
then this Indenture to be void Else in
full force & virtue In Witness whereof
we have hereunto set our hands & seals
