 Dollars also by promissory note of this date due
 Also the first day of January next Where said
 debts I am willing & desirous at the instance
 of said John H. & Henry T. to secure to be
 paid in Consideration of which said indebted
 sum as well as in Consideration of the
 sum of one dollar to me the said Heally
 in hand paid by said John H. Williams the
 Receipt of which is truly acknowledged
 I the said Coleman Heally have bargained
 and sold and do now by these Presents bargain
 and sell unto the said John H. Williams
 a Certain Negro Woman ~~Slave~~
 now in my possession and owned by me
 named Julia about twenty five years old
 To have and to hold unto the said John H.
 Williams his Executors and administrators for
 = Even the said Negro Woman together with
 the future Increase of said Woman and
 I the said Coleman Heally hereby Warrant
 and Will forever defend unto the said John
 H. Williams his Executors administrators
 or assigns the right & title to said Woman
 and her future increase against all
 persons whomsoever in trust however and
 these Presents are upon this Condition
 that I said Coleman Heally am to retain
 possession of said negro and her increase
 if any until default be made in whole
 or in part in the payment of said
 promissory notes or Either of them or
 any part thereof When the said John H.
 Williams may as soon thereafter as he
 his Executor administrator or assigns
 may think proper due and take said
 negro Woman together with her

future increase of any into his possession
 and after giving ten days notice thereof
 may sell said negro woman and increase
 of any at the Court House door of said
 County to the highest bidder for Cash
 and out of the proceeds thereof pay off
 and discharge said notes or whatever sum
 may be due and unpaid thereon. The
 balance of any pay over to said State
 retaining all necessary Expenses accruing
 by making this conveyance and said sale
 but should said notes be paid off &
 discharged on or before their maturity
 then this conveyance to be null void &
 of no effect In Witness Whereof I have

 1854
