

Know all men by these Presents that I, Andrew Watson for and in Consideration of the love and affection which I have for my Wife Martha A. Watson and for the further Consideration of making a Suitable Settlement according to my Estate upon my said Wife I give sell & lease and forever quit Claim to my said Wife Martha A. Watson a Negro man slave named Janny of black Color about twenty two years old to have and to hold to her sole and separate use free from all ~~claim~~ Claim of any one in any way during her natural life. and at her death to my son Campbell now in life and in the Event that my said Wife should have other Children by our Marriage then and in that Event to my said son Campbell & to his said brother and Sister or either in Equal Share forever and in the Event that my said wife should survive my said son and at her death my said Wife should have no issue of our said marriage alive then said negro to revert to my heirs at Law in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 25 day of June 1855
