

Wilson, Weston this indenture made and entered into this 21st day of August, 1856, between Western Wilson of the one part and David N. McClanahan of the other part witnesseth that whereas the said Western Wilson is justly indebted to the said D. N. McClanahan in the sum of Thirty-Seven  $24/100$  Dollars due by a judgment rendered before George Harris, a Justice of the Peace on the 4th day of February, 1856, and the said Western Wilson being anxious and desirous to secure the payment thereof for and in consideration of said indebtedness, and the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by said D. N. McClanahan - the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged - have sold and hereby sell and convey to said D. N. McClanahan the following described property, to wit, one yoke of oxen about three years old and one or cart: to have and to hold in trust as follows: It is agreed that the said Wilson shall retain the possession of said property until the first of January next; and if the said Western Wilson shall fully pay one half of said judgment by the ~~first~~ <sup>said</sup> first of January next then said Wilson is to retain the possession of property until the first day of December, 1857. Then if said Wilson shall pay or cause to be paid the remainder of said judgment and costs and the costs hereof then this obligation to be null and void; but upon default of said payment then said D. N. McClanahan is hereby authorized to take into possession said property and sell the same to the highest bidder for cash after giving twenty days' notice by advertisement posted up at three

public places in said county; and out of the proceeds  
of said sale retain said debt and interest thereon from this date,  
the costs of said suit, and the costs hereof, and the balance if  
any pay it over to said Weston Wilson. Given under my hand
