This Indenture, made and entered into this 26th day of January, 1859, between Charles Bragg of the county of Shelby ~~county~~ and state of Alabama of the first part, and Edmond King of the same place of the second part, and French Ndbors of the same place of the third part, witnesseth: That the said party of the first part is justly indebted to the said party of the second part in the sum of Four Hundred Dollars due by promissory note bearing even date with these presents due twelve months after date; and the said party of the first part being anxious and desirous to save harmless and secure the said party of the second part in the payment of the said sum of Four Hundred Dollars when the same shall fall due, as well as for the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, doth grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the third part a certain negro woman named Jane of dark complexion about

thirty-five years old: have and to hold unto the said party of the third part, his heirs and assigns for ever: In trust nevertheless, if the party of the first part shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid the said sum of Four Hundred Dollars when the same shall fall due, then this indenture to be null and void: but if the said party of the first part shall fail to pay said sum of Four Hundred Dollars or any part thereof when the same shall due, then the said party of the third part is hereby empowered upon first giving fifteen days notice by sticking up written notices in one or more public places in Shelby county to seize and take possession of said negroes herein before mentioned, and sell the same at public outcry in the town of Montevallo to the highest bidder for cash and appropriate the proceeds of said sale ~~according~~ to the satisfaction of this Deed of Trust and the remainder if any left to be paid to said party of the first part.
