This Indenture, made and entered into this 19th day of February, 1854, between Nancy C. Horton, widow and relict of Miles I. Horton, and Isaac Lawler and Nancy L., his wife, William Jordan and Sarah Ann his wife and Minor Horton & W. Hall Horton and Eliza M. his wife, children and heirs at law of the said Miles I. Horton, of the first part, and Wilie Horton of the second part, witnesseth: That heretofore in the life-time of the said Miles I. Horton, the said Miles I. and Wilie Horton, to wit on the 2nd day of October, 1855, purchased jointly of one Charles Prin the following described lands, to wit the North-East fourth of Section thirty-three (33) and the East half of the S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section thirty-four (34) in Township 21 of Range 1 East, and took a Deed thereto to them jointly; that afterwards the said Miles I. Horton & Wilie Horton divided said lands and mutually agreed upon lines dividing said lands, and each went into possession of their separate parts of said lands, and so continued to occupy and hold each his separate part up to the death of the said Miles I. Horton; but no deeds were ever executed between them, and in said vision the lines agreed upon between them is described in a plat made by one David N. Gray, County Surveyor of the County of Shelley to said Wilie Horton, beginning at the N.E. corner of section 33; thence South to a corner marked on said plat L, thence West along a line marked G to a corner marked K, thence South to a corner H thence West to the centre of Section 33, thence North to the North boundary line of said section, thence East with said line to the beginning, and so much of the said East half of the S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 34 as lies North

of a line designated in said plat J = K and East of a line from S to M. Now for and in consideration of the premises, the said parties of the first part hereby convey, confirm and for ever quit claim to the said Willie Horton, his heirs and assigns forever, the said lands so described and so held by him under said division and agreement.
