

This Indenture made and entered into this twenty first day of
 September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and forty one between James Moore of the
 County of Bibb and State of Alabama of the 1st part
 and William Moor of the County of Chickasaw and State
 of Mississippi of the 2nd part Witnesseth that whereas
 the said James Moore is willing and desirous on account
 of the natural love and affection which he the said James
 Moore bears for Elizabeth Moor Paralee Moor Mary
 Jane Moor John Moor James Moore and William
 Moore being the lawful Children of and heirs of the
 said William Moor and the Grand Children of the
 said James Moore to serve into the said above
 named Children of the said William Moor as
 well as the Children hereafter to be ^{lawfully} begotten by the
 said William Moor for their better support main-
 tenance and benefit now therefore for and in Con-
 sideration of the Premises and for the further Consi-
 deration of five dollars paid by the said party of the
 second part to the said party of the 1st part before
 the signing sealing and delivery of these presents
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the
 said party of the first part has bargained

sold and delivered and by these Parents doth bargain
 sell and deliver unto him the said party of the
 second part the following described negroes to wit
 one negro man slave named Labone aged about
 thirty five years one negro boy named George aged
 about twelve years and one negro girl named
 Adeline aged about two years with their increase to
 have and to hold to him the said party of the second
 part with warranty of title upon condition and in
 trust as follows to wit the said William Moore of
 the 2^d part is to have the use and possession of
 the said negroes and the benefit of their labour for
 and during his natural life and at his death the
 said negroes with their increase are to be equally
 divided amongst his lawful heirs by him begetting
 this Indenture further Witnesseth that should the said
 William Moore Commit or attempt to Commit Waste
 on the premises herein conveyed then and
 in that case the said James Moore reserves to himself
 the right to remove the said William Moore
 Trustee as aforesaid and appoint an other that the
 purposes and intentions of this trust did may be fully
 executed in Witness Whereof We have hereunto set
 our hands and affixed our seals the day & year
 above written - James ^{his} Moore Seal
