 of July, A. D. 1857, between Anthony C. Lewis, of the
 first part, and Abijah Lewis, of the second part,
 all of Shelby County, Alabama, witnesseth: That, for and
 in consideration of the sum of Fifty Dollars to the
 party of the first part in hand paid for by the party
 of the second part at and before the sealing and delivery
 of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 by the party of the first part hath given, granted, bargain-
 ed and sold, released, conveyed and confirmed, and by
 these presents doth give, grant, bargain, sell, release,
 convey and confirm unto him the said party of the
 second part, the following described tract of land,
 viz: the North-East fourth of the South-West fourth of
 Section No. 19 Township 20 of Range 3 West, containing
 thirty-nine $77\frac{1}{2}/100$ of Acres it lying and being in
 said county of Shelby and Tuscaloosa Land District:
 to have and to hold the above granted and bar-
 gained premises to him the said Abijah Lewis,
 his heirs and assigns forever, to his and their only
 proper use, behoof and benefit; and as for me and
 heirs and assigns, we will forever warrant and defend
 the title to the said party of the second part against all
 lawful claims or demands of all persons whatsoever.

and that I have good right and lawful authority to sell and dispose of the same in manner and form above stated. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this day and year first above written.
