 Thomas McGinnis the sum of Two Hundred and
 Forty-Five Dollars in full payment for a certain
 tract of land known as the S.W. 1/4 of the N.W. 1/4 and
 the N.W. 1/4 of South-West fourth of Section No. one Town-
 ship 19 Range two East in the District of Tuscaloosa and
 State of Alabama, containing eighty acres more or less;
 together with all and singular the right and privilege
 in anywise appertaining or belonging to said land
 & premises. And we the said Henry C. Brasher
 and M. H. Brasher, against ourselves, our heirs, assigns,
 &c. & every other person or persons with warrant
 & defend the right and title of said land and
 premises unto the only proper use, benefit and
 behoof of Thomas McGinnis, his heirs, assigns
 &c. in fee simple for ever. In Testimony whereof
