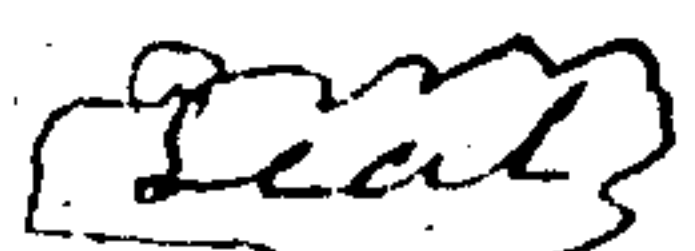

L. Morrow, party of the first part and Abram J. Wells
party of the second part, witnesseth that the said party
of the first part for and in consideration of the sum
of Two Hundred and Sixty Dollars to him duly paid.

before the delivery hereof, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, convey and confirm to the said party of the second part, his heirs & assigns forever, all that certain tract or parcel lying in said county of Shelby, known as the South-East quarter of the North-~~East~~^{West} quarter of Section five Township twenty-four (24) of Range thirteen East containing forty acres, more or less; together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said party of the first party therein; to have and to hold the above granted, bargained and described premises, with the appurtenances unto the said party of the second party, his heirs and assigns to his and their own proper use, benefit and behoof forever. And the said party of the first part doth hereby covenant and agree with the said party of the second part; that he is lawfully seized and possessed of the premises in fee simple absolute, and that he will warrant and defend the above granted premises to the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever against all and every person in law and equity.
