 five dollars to him in hand paid by Wil-
 liam C. Wilder the receipt of which is hereby
 acknowledged hath granted bargained sold
 and conveyed to the said William C. Wilder
 his heirs and assigns a parcel of lands lying
 in said County, to wit: the South East Quar-
 ter of South East Quarter of Section thirty six
 Township nineteen of Range two West & the
 West half of the South West Quarter and the
 North East Quarter of the South West Quarter
 of Section thirty one Township nineteen of
 Range one West to have and to hold the afore-
 said granted premises to the said William
 C. Wilder his heirs and assigns in fee simple
 for ever and we the said Ervin C. Horton and wife
 do Covenant with the said William C. Wilder

his heirs and assigns be that we our heirs
 executors and administrators shall and
 will warrant and defend the legal title
 to the said William C. Wilder his heirs or
 assigns forever against the claims or de-
 mands of all persons as Witness our hands and
 seals this the second day of November the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
 dred and fifty seven Edwin C. Horton Seal
