

McGehee This Indenture made and entered into this the 25-
 day of January A.D. 1858 between Thomas F. McGehee
 of Shelby County state of Alabama of the first part
 and Edmund King of said County and state
 of the second part and Charles C. Samuel of
 said County and state of the third part
 Witnesseth that said party of the first part is
 justly indebted to the said party of the second
 part in the sum of six hundred and nineteen
 and 90/100 dollars evidenced by his promissory note
 bearing even date with these presents due

and payable on the first day of January A.D. 1859 the payment of which said note the said party of the first part is anxious to secure to the said party of the second part. Now in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar to the said party of the first part in hand paid by the party of the third part the receipt, whereof is hereby acknowledged hereby grants bargains sells and conveys unto the said party of the third part a certain negro woman slave named Nancy about twenty years of age and her infant child slave named Julia Ann about six months of age, to have and to hold unto the said party of the third part his heirs and assigns forever in trust however that the said party of the first part have possession of said slaves until default be made in the payment of said note above described by said party of the first part. But if default be made in the payment of said note above described on the first day of January A.D. 1859 then the party of the third part shall be authorized to seize and sell said negro woman slave Nancy and her infant child Julia Ann at public outcry to the highest bidder for cash in the town of Montevallo Shelby County State of Alabama after giving thirty days notice of the time and place of said sale by posting up a written advertisement in said town of Montevallo and one other public place in said County and appropriate the proceeds of said sale first to the payment of said note and interest and then to the cost of this deed of trust.
