 Fulton of the first part and D. N. McClanahan & Co of the
 second part witnesseth that the said Samuel Fulton of the 1st part
 is justly indebted to the said D. N. McClanahan & Co of the 2^d
 part in the sum of Twenty Eight \$28.00 dollars being a judgment
 had before J. P. Allen J. P. 12th Decr 1857 which said debt said
 Samuel Fulton is anxious and desirous to secure and where
 the condition of said is for goods &c furnished by said
 D. N. McClanahan & Co to the said Samuel Fulton therefore the
 said Samuel Fulton is anxious and desirous to secure the
 payment of said debt therefore for and in consideration of the
 following property as well as the sum of one dollar to him
 in hand paid by the said D. N. McClanahan & Co the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged said Fulton has given granted
 bargained & sold and by these presents does give grant bargain
 and sell to said D. N. McClanahan & Co the following property
 to wit: N W 1/4 of S E 1/4 Section 6 Township 21 of Range 2 West
 to have & to hold the same forever upon Trust nevertheless
 and it is hereby expressly agreed and understood that
 said Fulton is to retain possession of said lands until
 said McClanahan & Co or his agent or attorney may think
 proper to close the same after the 25th day of December
 next then said McClanahan & Co upon default of the pay-
 ment of said debt for twenty Eight \$28.00 dollars may
 seize take and sell said property to the highest bidder for
 cash first giving thirty days notice of the time & place of
 said sale in at least three public places in said County and
 out of the proceeds of said sale pay said debt & costs thereof
 and balance if any pay over to the said Samuel Fulton
 but should the same be fully paid then this Deed of
 Trust be void and of no force otherwise to remain
 in full force & effect
