This Indenture Made and entered into This 18th day of February AD 1858 between George R. Vasser of the first part and Benjamin W. Page of the second part Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the love and affection which the said party of the first part hath for his wife Lucinda F. Vasser and for the further Consideration of five dollars to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said party of the first part has given and hereby gives bargain and conveys to the said party of the second part the following named Negro Slave Tomit Ann a girl to have and to hold in trust for the sole and separate use of the said Lucinda F. Vasser forever and it is hereby agreed and understood that the said Lucinda Vasser is to have the possession and use of said Negro free from the control management and disposition of the party of the first part and should the said Lucinda survive her said husband or otherwise become a feme sole the title to vest absolutely in her so however as not to be liable to the debt or liabilities of her present or any future husband Given under our hands and seals this day and year above written
