five \$45.00 dollars Secured by Three promissory Notes
1 dated on the 20th July 1858 & due on 1st Jan'y 1859
for \$674.00 dollars & One for Thirty \$30.00 dollars dated on
the 17th July 1858 & due on the 25th Dec'r 1858 & one for
Eight dollars dated on the 6th day of March 1858
& due on the 25th Dec'r 1858 & The said Ataway being
anxious & desirous to Secure the same has this day
bargained & sold & does by these presents bargain sell
& convey to the said James A. Mullins the following
Tract or parcel of land to wit the S E 1/4 of the
N W quarter of Sec No 4 in T No 22 R 15 Also
16 head of hogs & entire crop to be grown this year
(1858) to have and to hold the same so as to
Secure the payment of said notes & if default
be made in the payment of said notes in
whole or in part at their maturity then the said
Mullins shall proceed to sell the offore said property
to the highest bidder for cash and giving ten days
notice by advertisement & after paying the whole
of said notes together with the expenses of sale
& the conveyance pay over to the said Ataway or
the person legally claiming under him the Residue
if any nevertheless if said notes be paid at their
maturity then this obligation to be void otherwise
to remain in full force & effect in witness
of which I hereunto set my hand and seal this
6th day of March 1858
