Fowler and Elizabeth Fowler his wife of the first part and Jasper Goodson of the second part all of the County and state of aforesaid Mississippi that for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to us in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said Jasper Goodson the following parcel or tract of land viz the West half of the North West quarter of Section 11 the North half of the South East quarter and the North East quarter of Section No 10 in Township 20 of Range 2 West in the district of land subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama together with all and singular the appurtenances hereditaments and rights in any wise appertaining unto the said Jasper Goodson his heirs and assigns forever and we the said John E. Fowler and Elizabeth his wife for ourselves our heirs executors and administrators do warrant and will ever defend the right and title to the above described premises unto the said Jasper Goodson from and against the claim of every person or persons whatsoever.
