 the sum of ten dollars to me in hand
 paid by the said party of the second part
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-
 edged have bargained sold and conveyed
 and by these presents do bargain sell and
 convey unto the said party of the second
 part their heirs and assigns forever all

my right to dower or title interest claim or demand
in and to the following described lands to wit: the
North fourth of the South East fourth of section
four township twenty two (22) Range two West
containing forty acres more or less in the Huska-
loosa land district together with all and sin-
gular the appurtenances rents profits in and
to or in any wise belonging to the said prem-
ises to have and to hold unto the said party of
the second part their heirs assigns executors and
administrators from and I hereby warrant
and defend the title to the above described
premises to the said party of the second part
their heirs assigns executors and adminis-
trators forever against the claim or claim
demand or demands of any and all persons
whatever claiming the same. In witness
