The State of Alabama, This Indenture made
 Shelby County } and entered into this
 the twentieth day of March one thousand
 eight hundred and fifty eight between
 John B. Blake of the first part and H. J.
 Hill & Co and Bowers Sumner and Co of
 the second part (according to the amount
 of their respective claims) Witness that
 whereas the said party of the first part
 is justly indebted to the said parties of the
 second part in the just sum of one
 hundred and ten dollars and the said
 party of the first part being desirous of se-
 curing said parties of the second part by
 giving them a mortgage on a certain one
 horse buggy and harness, One double barrel
 shot gun one trap clock and all ap-
 purtenances belonging to the above describ-
 ed articles now in the possession of the above
 named party of the first part also one
 red sided Cow with white Back two three
 year old heifers marked with smooth crop
 in left ear and one two year old
 heifer all of the same mark. Now
 if the above named party of the first
 part fails to discharge the above named
 debt by the first day of December next
 it shall be lawful for the said parties
 of the second part to take into their

proportion the above described property and cause
 the same to be advertised and sold by a law-
 ful officer. In testimony whereof I have here-

 and year above written John B. Blake
