This Indenture made and entered into this 8th day of May 1858 between Warren Adams of the first part and William Ozley of the second part witnesseth that whereas the said party of the second part has become bail for the said party of the first part by joining with him in four bonds Conditioned that said party of the first part make his personal appearance at the next term of the Circuit Court for Shelby County to answer an indictment to be found in said four several Cases for delivering spirituous liquors to a slave Edmund and Nash in the employ of the Alabama and Tennessee River rail road Company and the said party of the first part being desirous to secure the said William Ozley against said liability now in consideration of the premises the said Warren Adams hereby sells and Conveys unto the said William Ozley the following described property to wit one two horse waggon and harness one buggy and harness one yoke of oxen one red the other white two sows and nine shoats one cow and calf the cow black and white pitted one note on Thomas Ozley for ten 10/100 dollars due twenty fifth day of December next

one note on John Nash for about sixteen dollars due at same time one note on Armas M. Elliott for about nineteen dollars one note on Charles Bragg and Elias Moore for sixty dollars due twenty fifth of December next one note on William Brim for fifty five dollars also due at same time one note on Richmond Butler for twenty dollars due at same time two Bases Tobacco supposed to be 180 lbs to have and to hold in trust as follows it is agreed that said William Oyley is to hold said property until the next term of the Circuit Court of said County and if the said Warren Adams shall appear at said next term of said Circuit Court and answer to said indictments as required by said bonds or otherwise release said William Oyley from liability on said bonds then said William Oyley is to return said property but should said Warren Adams fail to so appear and release the liability on said bonds then in that event the said William Oyley is hereby authorized to sell said property for Cash after giving twenty days notice by advertisement posted up at three public places in said County and out of the proceeds of said sale retain and apply to the payment of all such damages costs and expenses as he may be subjected to by reason of said bonds &c and the balance if any pay over to said Warren Adams Given under my hand this day and year above written
