

This Indenture made and entered into this 5th day
 of June 1838 between Enoch Autry debtor of the first part
 and William McAllen Trustee of the Second part
 and Robert R. Rushing and Allen Rushing & Son
 and Allen Rushing & Co Creditors of the third
 part witnesseth That whereas the said fourth of
 the first part is justly indebted to Robert R.
 Rushing in the sum of twenty one dollars due
 by promissory note on the twenty fifth day of
 December next and is also indebted to Allen
 Rushing & Son for twenty five $25/100$ dollars in an
 account due 1st January 1837 made by Susan
 Autry and twenty five $25/100$ dollars due by
 account on 1st January 1838 made by Susan
 Autry and in the further sum of fifty four $54/100$
 dollars due by account on 1st January 1837 made
 by Elizabeth Autry and also in the sum of fourteen
 $14/100$ dollars due by account on 1st January 1838
 made by Elizabeth Autry and also the further
 sum of three dollars due by account on the
 1st January 1838 made by self and to said
 Allen Rushing & Co in the further sum of one
 account now making with the said Allen
 Rushing & Co for goods &c furnished by them

to the said Enock Autry and family such as may be necessary and be furnished during the Present Year and the said party of the first part being desirous to secure the payment of the said second indebtedness above stated and to be made for and in consideration of said indebtedness and the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has bargained & sold and hereby bargain ^{sell} and convey with the said party of the second part all his growing crop of Cotton the said Enock Autry to Cultivate and Gather the said Cotton by the 1st day of January next in trust however upon the following Conditions viz that if said Enock Autry shall satisfy the several sums above specified by the 1st day of January next then this conveyance to be void but should he fail to pay said indebtedness above specified or any portion thereof by said 1st day of January next then the said Wm. C. Allen shall be authorized & is hereby empowered to take possession of said Cotton & dispose of the same at public or private sale as he may deem best & with the proceeds of said sale after paying the expenses of this conveyance pay off & satisfy said debt or so much thereof as shall then remain unpaid & interest thereon In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals the day & year above written.
