Shelby County 3 This Indenture made and entered into this 3rd day of November A D 1837 between Andrew J. Bayley Harriet Bayley husband and wife of the first part and John B. Fleming of the second part witnesses That the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & seventy dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have sold and hereby sell confirm and convey unto the said party of the second part the following described land lying in Shelby County State of Alabama to wit The fractional Section seven in Township four of Range Seven East containing fifty five acres more or less on the west side of the Coosa River from Spring Creek to Bonshoro ferry to have and to hold to said second party his heirs and assigns forever the above described and hereby granted land and premises And the said parties of the first part husband and wife hereby covenant with the said party of the second part that we and lawfully signed and have good right to sell and convey said land and hereby bind ourselves our heirs and legal representatives forever to warrant and defend the title to the said land and premises to the said party of the second part his heirs assigns and legal representatives against the claim of all and every person in law or Equity and against the Government of the United States
