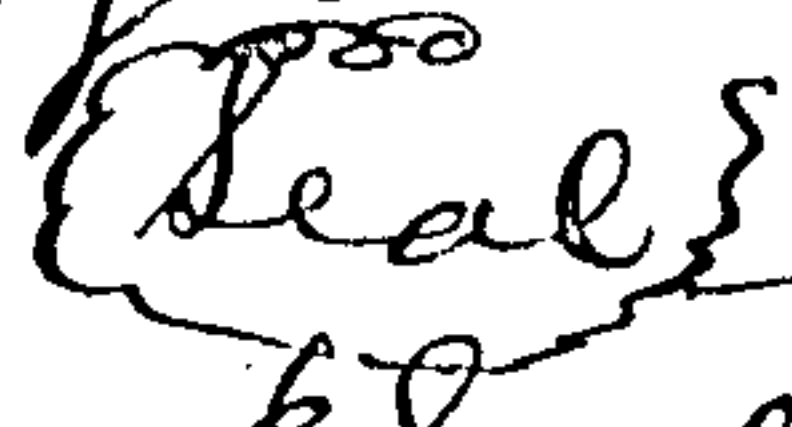
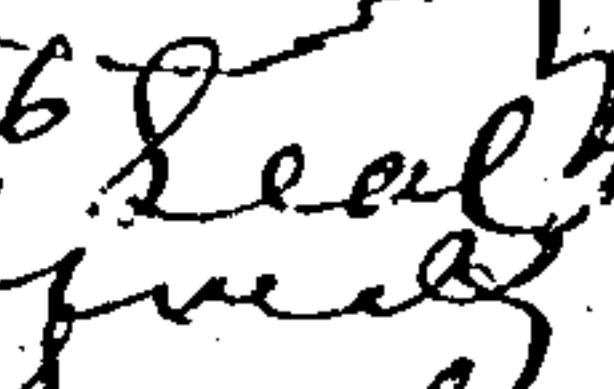
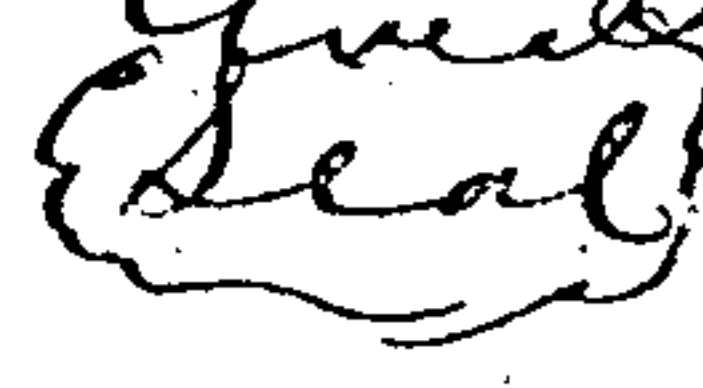


Streety To

 Shelby County } entered into, this 19th day of
 August 1858 between } John H. Streety debtor of the
 first part and David N. McLanahan & John
 M. McLanahan creditor of the 2nd part witnesseth
 that whereas the said party of the first part is
 justly indebted to the party of the 2nd part in the
 sum of Thirty Nine 27/100 Dollars due by two
 promissory notes first of said notes due one day
 after date and dated this day for Twenty eight
 16/100 Dollars & payable to D. N. McLanahan the other
 of said notes dated & due to day & payable to said
 J. M. McLanahan for Eleven 1/100 and payable one
 day after date & dated 19 August 1858 and the said
 party of the 1st part being desirous to secure the payment
 of said indebtedness for and in consideration thereof
 and for the further consideration of the sum of one
 Dollar to the said party of the 1st part in hand paid
 by the said party of the 2nd part the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged the said party of the 1st part
 has sold and hereby sells & conveys to the said
 party of the second part the following described
 property to wit: all his present growing crop of
 cotton that said Streety may raise or cause
 to be raised the present year to have & to hold

in trust as follows. It is hereby agreed that the said party of the first part is to have & retain possession of the said party property until the first day of December 1858 And if the said party of the first part shall fully pay to the said party of the second part said debt with interest thereon and the reasonable expenses hereof by said first day of December 1858 Then this Indenture is to be null & void, But upon default of such payment the said party of the 2nd part is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash after giving Ten days notice of the time & place of said sale by advertisement posted up at three places (public) And out of the proceeds of said sale retain the said sum of Thirty Nine $\frac{27}{100}$ Dollars and interest thereon and the reasonable costs hereof and the balance if any pay to the said party of the 1st part
