The State of Alabama } This indenture made and entered
 Shelby County } into this 4th day of November 1858
 between Alexander Steele debtor of the first part and
 John C. Campbell Creditor of the second part Witnesseth
 that whereas the said party of the first part is justly indebted
 to the party of the second part in the sum of one hundred
 & sixty six dollars and twenty cents due by two promissory
 notes one for Sixty Six dollars and 25/100 due the twenty
 fifth Dec 1858 The other for ninety dollars due 1st day
 of January 1859 and the said party of the 1st part being aware
 of securing the payment of said indebtedness for & in consideration
 thereof & for further consideration of the sum of one dollar to
 the said party of the first part in hand paid by the said party of
 the second part The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 the said party of the first part has sold and hereby sells &
 conveys to the said party of the second part the following
 described property To wit, Three hundred bushels of Corn
 one horse mule mousa colored known as the Dumas
 mule to have & to hold in trust as follows: It is hereby agreed
 that the said party of the 2^d part is to have & retain possession
 of said property until the first day of January 1859 and
 if the said party of the first part shall fully pay to the said
 party of the second part said debt with interest thereon and
 the reasonable expenses thereof by said first of January 1859
 then this indenture is to be null & void. But upon default of
 such payment the said party of the second part is hereby
 authorized to take into possession and sell said property
 to the highest bidder for cash after giving twenty days
 notice of the time & place of said sale by advertisement posted

up at three public places and out of the proceeds of said sale retain the said sum of said notes and interest thereon and the reasonable costs hereof and the balance if any pay to the said party of the first part
