

The State of Alabama, This instrument made and
 Shelby County, I entered into this 24th day of
 December 1838 between Alexander S. D. Sellers
 of the first part and J. H. Brantner Constable of
 the 2nd part Voluntary That Whereas the said
 part of the 1st part is justly indebted to the party
 of the 2nd part in the sum of twenty and no dollars
 by note and account just due but further
 delayance is now made the 31st December 1839
 and payable on or before the 1st day of
 1840 and the said party of the 1st part (being desirous)
 to secure the payment of said indebtedness for
 and in consideration thereof and for the further
 consideration of the sum of one dollar to the
 said part of the 1st part in hand paid the
 said party of the 2nd part the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged the said party of the 1st
 part has sold and lawfully sell and convey to
 the said part of the 2nd part the following described
 property to wit place Bay horse & mule about

four years of age to have and to hold in trust as follows It is hereby agreed that the said party of the 1st part is to have and retain possession of the said property until the 31st day of December 1839 and if the said party of the 1st part shall fully pay to the said party of the 2nd part said debt with interest thereon and the reasonable expense incurred by said 31st day of December 1839 then this indulgence is to be null and void.

But upon default of such payment the said party of the 2nd part is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash after giving twenty days notice of the time and place of said sale by advertisement posted up at three public places and out of the proceeds of said sale retain the said sum of twenty five dollars and interest thereon and the reasonable cost hereof and the balance if any pay to the said party of the 1st part.
