This Indenture made and entered into this 5th day of Oct 1858
between Eleanor B. Barnett by her attorney in fact Dixon
McClendon of the first part and John Harkins of the second
part Witnesseth that on the 16th day of January 1857 the
said party of the first part by her said attorney in fact made
and delivered to the said party of the second part her deed
conveying certain lands therein described upon which certain
buildings situate the tavern house before that time occupied by

The said party of the first part then Eleanor B Owen and by mistake the following described lot of land was left out which was ~~embraced~~ ^{embraced} in said bargain of sale and intended to have been embraced in said deed to wit. Commencing at a stake near an old Carriage Shopper in front of said tavern house on the section line thence west to the alley forming the eastern boundary of the old plain of the town of Columbiana said alley runs north and south by the stable now occupied by W S Sawyer thence north with said alley to the line of a lot known as Joseph Ropers near to the old Black Smiths shop in which David Owen received the blow which caused his death thence east to said section line front of the Tavern house thence south with said section line to the beginning containing all the open shop forming the wide street from said Tavern house to the Court house which lies east of said alley eastern boundary of said town now the said party of the first part hereby confirms and conveys the said land to the said party of the second part to him his heirs and assigns forever under the same covenants and for the same consideration expressed in said deed above referred to which said deed is recorded in the probate Court for said County of Shelby in deed book 2 pages 707 & 708 and for the purpose of hereby doing and completing the conveyance in said deed specified according to the bargain of sale therein expressed Given under my hand and seal this day and year above written
