 justly indebted to the party of the 2nd part in the sum of
 Eight dollars due by his promissory note of this date and
 payable on or before the first day of January next 1860
 and the said party of the 1st part being desirous to secure
 the payment of said indebtedness for and in consideration
 thereof and for the further consideration of the sum
 of one dollar to the said Party of the 1st part in
 hand paid by the said party of the 2nd part the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said
 party of the first part has sold and hereby sells

and Conveys to the said party of the 2nd part the following described property to wit: One Gray Mare: (mule) (high-ly) the party of the 1st part of the Estate of P. A. Mosley & Co. whose Cows & Calves & twenty head of ^{Stock} ~~horses~~ now in the possession of the party of the 1st part to have and to hold in trust as follows: It is hereby agreed that the said party of the 1st part is to have and retain possession of the said property until the first day of January next 1860 and if the said party of the 1st part shall fully pay to the said party of the 2nd part said debt and the reasonably expenses hereof by the first day of January next 1860 then this ^{agreement} ~~agreement~~ is to be null and void.

But upon default of such payment the said party of the 2nd part is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash after giving Ten days notice of the time and place of said sale by advertisement posted up at three public places and out of the proceeds of said sale retain the said sum of Seventy dollars and interest thereon and the reasonable costs incurred and the balance of any pay to the said party of the 1st part.
