 Shelby County 3 That I James Bayley of the State and
 County of said do hereby sell and convey unto James
 D. Trague in trust the following property to wit forty
 acres of land the South East $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 32
 Township 19 Range East Two Cows and Calves and
 Saddle young horse or any other horse or mule
 the said Bayley may have during the present year and
 the entire crop of Cotton made by said Bayley
 the present year the above conveyance is made
 to the said Trague to secure the payment of a note
 made payable to John T. Brownell for one hundred
 dollars due the first day of January 1860 signed by
 James Bayley personally James D. Trague Secretary
 and the said Bayley agrees to deliver the Cotton to the
 said Trague as fast as he gathers the same and
 upon his failure to do so at any time the
 property is likely to be put out of the way the said
 Trague may seize said property and by giving two
 days notice of the time and place of sale sell the
 personal property first and then the real estate
 sufficient to pay said debt and expenses of selling
 and after paying said debt and expenses the proceeds
 if any be paid to said Bayley but if said Bayley
 shall pay said debt the above conveyance to be
 null and void Given under my hand and
