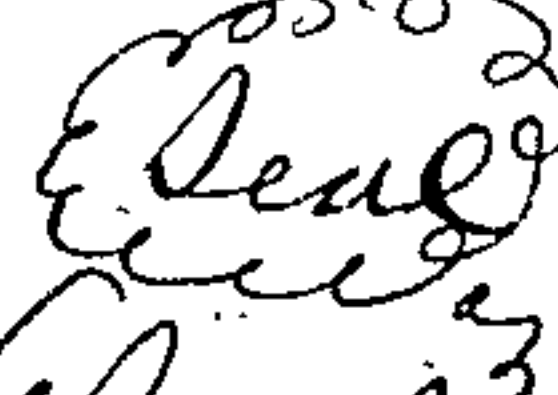
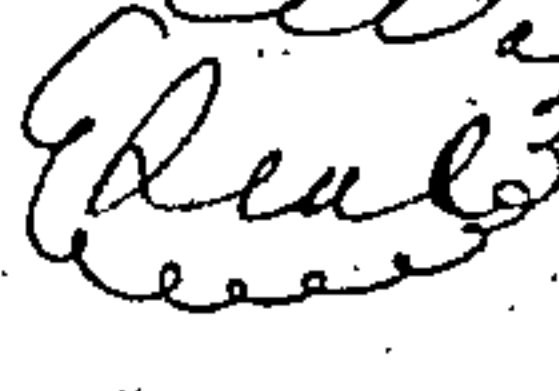

Dallas County Alabama: Witnesseth that for and in consideration
of the sum of fifty Dollars to use in hand paid by the party
of the second part the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge
have given, granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth
give grant bargain sell release convey confirm unto the said
E. J. Watts the following described tract or parcel of land viz:
The East half of the South East fourth of section one Township
Twenty two (22) Range four (4) N.E. lying and being

in the County of Shelby and State of Alabama and Tuscaloosa
 land district together with all singular the appertinances and
 hereditaments therunto belonging to him the said E. J. Watts and
 we do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said E. J. Watts
 that we will ever warrant & defend the title to the above described
 land against all lawful claims & demands of all persons
 whatsoever. In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hand
 and seals this the day & year above written.
