

This indenture made and executed by and between
 Henry I Sawyer as Sheriff of Shelby County of the first
 part and Joseph R Gore of Dallas County as trustee of
 the second part and Bogkin and McRae & Dunklin
 Joel White Hunter & King Thomas F Lewis Harrison
 Dunklin & Co W B Gill G L & J R Poor E K Carlisle &
 W Pick W P Noble P J Mavor W E Posey A Hill
 McKinnon & S S Shannon and W H Franklin of
 the other part witnesses that the said parties of the
 third part at the Spring Term 1838 of the Circuit
 Court of Dallas County State of Alabama obtained
 several judgments against George D Shortridge as

Upon which said several judgments executed
were duly issued & placed in the hands of the party
of the first part to be executed in due form of law
and the party of the first part leased the same upon
the equity of redemption of the said George O. Shoolbridge in
the property embraced in a certain deed of trust execu-
ted by the said Shoolbridge on the fourth day of
May 1858 to Rufus W. Cobb in trust for the purposes
in said deed specified which said deed of trust
& said Cobb is of record in the Office of the Judge
of Probate Court of Shelby County in Book All pages
1355 to 359. included and whereas the parties of the
third part entered into an agreement to purchase
said equity of redemption at Sheriff Sale and
upon such Sale and purchase to pay said
equity of redemption in proportion to the amount of
their said several judgments and whereas the parties
of the third part have advanced and gone to advance
15 per cent upon their respective judgments for the purpose
of paying to the said Sheriff prior executions liens upon
said trust property in his hands for collection and to take
the title from said Sheriff to the party of the second
part in to wit for their benefit and whereas by virtue
of said liens of said executions and by orders of said
Honorable Court from the Circuit Court of Shelby County
the said Sheriff offered the said equity of redemption
of the said George O. Shoolbridge in and to the property
embraced in said deed of trust for sale in the Town
of Monticello on Monday the 34 day of January A.D. 1859
according to previous advertisement at public auction to
the highest bidder for cash and at said sale W. H. Fellows
as agent for the parties of the third part purchased said
equity of redemption in the name of Joseph R. Cobb in trust
as aforesaid at and for the sum of fourteen hundred
dollars that being the highest and best bid. Now therefore
the party of the first part in consideration of the promises
and in consideration of the sum of fourteen hundred
dollars in part credited upon said executions and
in part paid in cash in discharge of executions
having prior liens upon the said trust property as
aforesaid to the said agent of the party of the third
part at and before the making and delivery of
these presents has granted conveyed and sold
and by these presents does grant convey and sell

to the party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever. The equity of redemption of the said George Shortridge in and to the property embraced in said deed of trust from said Shortridge to said Coble embracing the following real & personal property to wit all the tract or parcel of land upon which said Shortridge reside within the limits of the deed of trust lying and lying near the Town of Moultrieville in Shelby County Ala containing one hundred and thirty acres more or less and negro boy slave named Henry about 26 years old a negro woman named Caroline about 30 years old and his two children John about 9 years & Daniel Kaskins about 1 year of age a negro boy slave named Bob about 40 years old a negro boy named Peter his wife Betsey each about 60 years old a negro boy slave named Lewis about twenty years old a negro boy slave named Jack about eighteen years old said two last named slaves Lewis & Jack being the slaves mortgaged by one Howard Shortridge & one Burrill Boykin and the said mortgage transferred by the administrator of the said Burrill Boykin to said George Shortridge also ~~Household~~ Kitchen furniture Buggy & Harness two horse Wagon & Harness three Cows & Calves Stock of Hogs Water or dump Cart &c as shown by said deed of trust which said equity of redemption to be held by the party of the second part in trust for the parties of the third part in proportion to the amount of their said several executions. And the parties of the third part hereby confer upon the parties of the second part full power to manage & close up said trust property either by sale or by settlement with said Rufus W. Coble Trustee as aforesaid according to the list of his Judgment and discretion.
