

The State of Alabama This indenture made
 Shelby County and entered in to the 12
 day of March 1859 between A. S. Bayley debtors
 of the 1st part and A. M. Elliott Creditor of the
 second part Witnesseth That whereas the said
 party of the 1st part is lawfully indebted to the
 party of the 2nd part in the sum of one hundred
 and 50 dollars due by a promissory note made
 by said A. S. Bayley to said A. M. Elliott
 dated 12th day of March 1839 and payable
 on or before the first day of January 1839
 and the said party of the 1st part being dis-
 -posed to secure the payment of said ind-
 -entured for and in consideration thereof and
 for the further consideration of the sum of one
 dollar to the said party of the 1st part in
 hand paid by the said party of the 2nd part
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the
 said party of the 1st part has sold and
 hereby sells and conveys to the said party
 of the 2nd part the following described property
 to wit one Blind Bay Horse about eight
 or nine years old and one Bay Mare
 about four years old with both colts
 Capped the same that the said Bayley
 has now in his possession to have and
 to hold in trust as follows It is hereby agreed
 that the said party of the 1st part is to have
 and retain possession of the said property
 until the 1st day of January 1839 and if
 the said party of the 1st part shall fully
 pay to the said party of the 2nd part said
 debt with interest thereon and the reason-
 -able expenses hereof by the 1st day of January
 1839 then this Indenture is to be null and
 void But upon default of such payment
 the said party of the 2nd part is hereby auth-
 -orized to take into possession and sell said
 property to the highest bidder for cash after
 giving thirty days notice of the time and
 place of said sale by advertisement posted
 up at three public places and out of the
 proceeds of said sale retain the said
 sum of one hundred dollars and
 interest thereon and the reasonable costs
 hereof and the balance of any mony to the
 said party of the 1st part Given under
