 is hereby acknowledged and of other good
 and valuable considerations of the said
 Samuel Fulton have bargained and sold and
 confirmed to the said James P. Allen the
 following property Viz One third Gray
 Mare about twelve years old & one bay
 mare about twelve years old to have
 and to hold the above described property
 to him & his heirs forever. The condition of
 this conveyance is such that if the said
 Samuel Fulton shall well & truly pay to the
 said William Leonard the sum of
 fifty six 25/100 with all interest & cost
 and charges according to the tenor and
 effect of said this conveyance to be void
 otherwise to remain in full force and
 the said James P. Allen shall at all times after
 the maturity of said note have power to take
 into possession & sell at Public Sale after
 giving ten days notice of the time and the
 said Gray mare & Bay Mare for the purpose
 of satisfying the said Note of purchase
