

The State of Alabama Shelby County
 For Consideration that John P. Allen Henry S. Hill
 John T. Morgan Charles G. Samuel & Rufus W. Cobb
 have become the Suitor of Fuldoy Thosash (my
 husband) and have with him confessed a judg-
 ment in the Circuit Court of Shelby County for the sum
 of fifty dollars and the Cost of indictment decided at
 the Spring Term 1838 and said parties having
 become much mortified and having confessed said
 Judgment at my request and said Cobb &
 Samuel as parties and John T. Morgan as partners
 having defended said Case at my request and
 being each entitled to five of fifty dollars which I have
 promised to pay for Charles & Thosash a married
 woman wife of Fuldoy Thosash and having a separa-
 -state Consideration of a certain negro girl named
 Elizabeth Ann aged about fourteen years do-
 hereby sell convey and deliver slave to
 Rufus W. Cobb in trust for herself and the
 other persons hereinafter named that if said

Filden Throash shall fail to pay said Judgments
 against said parties for said fine and
 Costs so as to save his securities harmless
 then as shall fail to pay said Judgments
 for fine & costs & damages of Bogard & Morgan
 as before said by the first day of September
 1839 then said Cobb shall take said Slave
 into possession and sell him in the town of
 Monteville to the highest bidder for cash and
 out of the Proceeds of such sale he shall
 pay off and satisfy said Judgments for
 fine & Costs against said Throash and the
 fine due to the other parties herein named
 & balance he shall pay over to the said
 Lane & Throash. In witness whereof the
 said Lane & Throash and Filden Throash
 his husband have hereunto set their
 hands and seals on this the 23rd day of
 March 1839.
