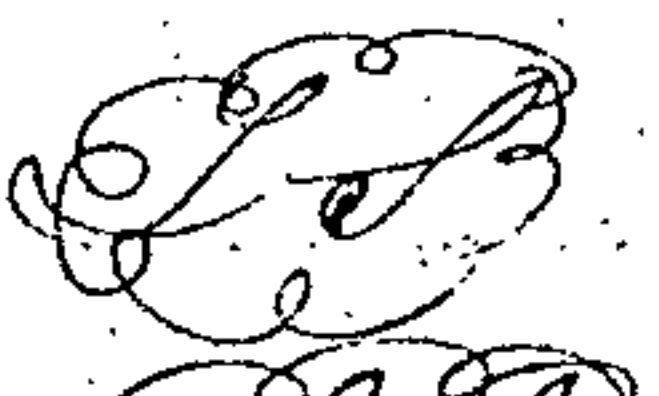
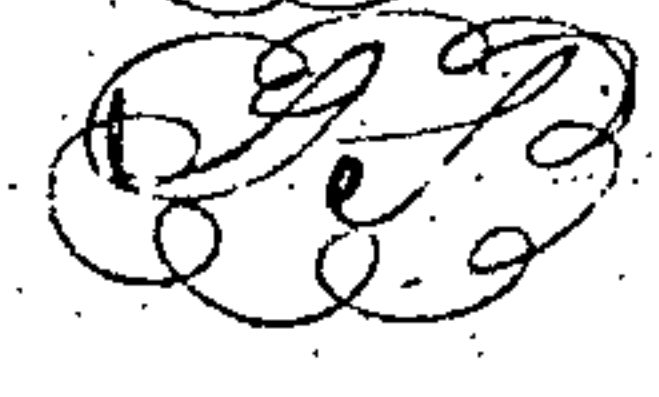


The State of Alabama This indenture made and  
 Shelby County 3 entered into this 29 day of April  
 1839 between Alexander Stut ~~first part~~ and John C Campbell ~~second part~~  
 Manifests That whereas the said party of the 1st  
 part is justly indebted to the party of the 2nd part  
 in the sum of one hundred and seven 50c  
 dollars due by promissory note on the 1st day  
 of November 1839 dated the 1st day of October 1839 and  
 payable on or before the 1st day of November 1839  
 and the said party of the 1st part being desirous to  
 secure the payment of said indebtedness for  
 and give consideration thereof and for the further  
 consideration of the sum of one dollar to the  
 said party of the 1st part in hand paid by  
 the said party of the 2nd part the receipt where-  
 of is hereby acknowledged the said party of  
 the 1st part has sold and hereby sells and  
 conveys to the said party of the 2nd part the  
 following described property to wit all of my  
 crop of Corn & Cotton to be planted & grown  
 the present year also a horse mule mule  
 colour brown as the Dumas mule also subject  
 to a lien held by Joseph Roper on my land I  
 include subject to said lien the eight acres  
 of land on which I now reside the same  
 claimed owned and occupied by me at  
 present to have and to hold in trust as follows:  
 It is hereby agreed that the said party of the 1st  
 part is to have and retain possession of the said  
 property until the 1 day of Nov 1839 and if the  
 said party of the 1st part shall fully pay to the  
 said party of the 2nd part said debt with interest  
 thereon and the reasonable expenses hereof by  
 said 1 day of Nov 1839 then this Indenture

is to be null and void. But upon default of such payment the said party of the first part is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash after giving twenty days notice of the time and place of said sale by advertisement posted up at three public places and out of the proceeds of said sale return the said sum of and interest thereon and the reasonable costs hereof and the balance if any pay to the said party of the first part Given under our hands and seals this day and year above written
